On November 13, 2019, the Government of Saskatchewan released "Saskatchewan's Growth Plan - The Next Decade of Growth/2020-2030", a roadmap to grow the province's economy over the next 10 years. This plan recognizes the importance of cultural, recreation and sport opportunities to improve the quality of life in our communities. Through Saskatchewan Lotteries, all communities and thousands of sport, culture and recreation organizations are supported throughout the province.

The Ministry of Parks, Culture and Sport and Sask Sport Inc. recently launched a campaign to raise awareness of the tools and resources available to assist coaches, athletes and parents to address and prevent bullying, harassment, abuse and discrimination in sport. Sask Sport Inc. is a leader in Canada with their dispute resolution services and tools such as: The Respect in Sport Resource Line; and the Respect in Sport online training program. These efforts align with the Red Deer Declaration for the Prevention of Harassment, Abuse and Discrimination in Sport which all federal, provincial and territorial Ministers recently endorsed.

## POINTS TO KEEP IN MIND WHEN SUBMITTING YOUR 2021 APPLICATION FORM FOR THE SASKATCHEWAN LOTTERIES COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM

> The populations are recorded according to the 2016 Census figures from Statistics Canada or the December 2018 figures from the Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada. The eligible amount has been determined based on this population figure and the per capita amount. Please do not adjust the population figures and/or per capita rates on the application form unless you are keeping some of the population for your community and allocating the rest to another community.

> For communities receiving an allocation, the rate for Rural Municipalities is \$6.35.

> This year, your community will be applying for funding for the 2021 grant year.

➤ Communities that receive a grant of \$2,000 or less will no longer be limited to 25% of the grant for operational costs of facilities.

Starting with the 2020 grant year, Fireworks will be limited to 25% of the grant received for each program to a maximum of \$500 per program. Communities that receive a grant of \$2,000 or less will not be limited to 25%.

> Daycare facilities are not eligible for funding.

> If you are allocating your **total** population to a neighboring community, please **<u>do not</u>** send in your application form; have the Mayor, Reeve or Chief sign in section "B" on the application form of the community applying for the funds or submit a letter indicating which communities are to receive your population allocations. **A Carbon Copy to the Trust of these letters is helpful.** 

> If your community is not intending to apply, please consider allocating your population to a neighboring community.

> Organized Hamlets can apply; however, since their population is included in the R.M. population, they must have an allocation from their Rural Municipality.

> Applications are to be forwarded to the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Office no later than **February 28, 2020**. Your application can be mailed, emailed or faxed. You will receive a confirmation letter from our office verifying the receipt of your application.

> A bonded authorized officer of the community refers to the mayor, reeve, chief, band administrator or municipal administrator of the applying community.

The Dispute Resolution policy suite, found in the "Programs and Resources" section of the Sask Sport website, consists of the following policy and procedure components:

- Discipline and Complaints Policy and Flowchart
- Appeal Policy and Flowchart
- Alternative Dispute Resolution (Mediation) Policy
- Code of Conduct Policy (designed to be inclusive and encompassing of all types of behaviors under one policy, and to be in effect for the Board of Directors, committees, other volunteers, coaches, managers, officials, parents and spectators
- Conflict of Interest Policy as this is a key area where dispute situations often arise
